THE BRIEF BIBLIOGRAPHY PROJECT

The Brief Bibliography Project was initiated in 1985 by the Technical Assistance Committee of the Association for Gerontology in Higher Education. It is now coordinated by the Publications Committee.

The purpose of the project is to provide a series of brief annotated bibliographies on various subject areas related to gerontological instruction. The bibliographies are not designed to be complete listings of all current materials in each subject area, but rather are intended to be a selected list of the best quality education and training materials in each subject area.

The bibliographies are designed to: (1) assist faculty in the field of gerontology in selecting the best materials to use in courses they are structuring; and (2) provide a suggested list of books, articles, journals, and other resources which gerontology programs should acquire for their libraries.

Two compilers are generally selected for each bibliography through a process of nomination by the Publications and Executive Committees. Compilers are encouraged to work independently in developing the bibliographies, combining their listings into one "Brief Bibliography" at the final stage.
