Be All You Can Be--Teach! Twelve Steps to Help Teachers Flourish

Every teacher should take specific, concrete steps to flourish in the classroom; however, these steps are not the same for everyone. In this workshop, Tara Gray presents her own twelve steps based on twenty years of full-time teaching.

As you hear Tara's presentation, decide what specific, concrete steps you should take in the classroom to be all that you can be. Draft the steps you personally want to take, share them with others and hear the steps they have written. Finally, go forth and flourish: Be All You Can Be--Teach!
