Questions:

Nikki: Last spring, we had Grace here talking about a program. I am wondering if this is still happening.

Luca: Grace did amazing she is still here and still wonderful. She worked fast therefore the two-year fellowship was done in one. We are now in search although to fill this position and continue the work.

Rishabh: I had a question about the Campus Climate Survey. Was the data different then last year with the students who took it?

Luca: We know that it is less then last year. It is in double digits. But we do not know all the information yet. I do know more faculty and staff took this than students. Last time we did this survey there was a lot of intense driven discontent. We thought that last time was a strange lip. A lot was happening at the same time at that point. We are hoping this test helps us set strategies in the center for the future.

Lili: I wanted to know what you have learned from all your committees.

Luca: That's a great question. On many committees that I am on we are looking at goals and tangible outcomes. We assess and measure to make sure we are completing our goals. There are somewhere things that is more concrete than others. One of the reasons the biased outcome team exists is actually due to previous climate surveys. I am in the coaching role on this committee. We do not investigate which some students get upset with but we will supply resources and support. Sometimes in committees, we set goals for a year and then make sure it follows through. An example is if you saw we are putting religious holidays on the school calendar. Each of us on the committees brings to the table different experiences and backgrounds. It is a strategic and coordinated effort.

Noah: Thank you so much for being so passionate. You have made so many students feel that much safer. My question regards to the religious and spiritual life role have you found anyone yet?

Luca: We have been searching. We will have a nationwide search. I am right now the behind-the-scenes role. If you have any questions you can come to me. That role is coming very soon.

Nikki: You have talked about strategies. Is the goal a five-year plan?

Luca: I am glad you asked that. I like it when things work in steps. This institution when things happen that all of the ism's the school functions exactly the way it was designed. I do not mean individual people. However, left on auto-pilot institutions such as IC were built this way. Yes, to a five-year plan. We are trying to give voice and address everything up to this point. Yes, there will be a plan but will it be 5 years one year one week? The needs of the institution's students are 110% with everything they are bringing up. These same things have been happening for years. It shouldn't be that students have to keep bringing these things up again and again. This will take effort and I want to do it strategically.

Carli: I was going to ask about other initiatives that the last climate survey tackled that we are seeing today.

Luca: Yes! As for equity and inclusion, there is constantly a change of group of people. There is not one way to make sure all students have the same baseline. There was not one overall universal way that new students joining our community would have a baseline. We added the DEI module before coming to campus. There is the online module and other events that take place during orientation. The climate survey told us that last time and now since then we want to make sure that students are completing these courses and doing these experiences. Those components have come into play this year showing the rate of completion and types of students likely or unlikely to complete it. As well as how we can support them in completing it. As you can see, I am very excited about this. I have worked all my life in collaborations using my power and privilege in order to better. Sometimes that work is not done in a straight line. Having an actual office will b able to track these things and make things apparent when things need more work.

Molly: I appreciate everything your office is doing. My question is are the resources for students confidential?

Luca: That is a great question. Anyone can walk in our office and welcome them to resources and support. If it is stuff in regard to sexual assault. It is a space where they can share anything and it will stay private if they want it to. There is someone with the role that they have to leave this confidential. There are confidential resources available and I can direct students to these people.

Rishabh: I wanted to ask about an article in the Ithacan. I wanted to know if your office as seen it and what actions are being put in place.

Luca: Yes, everyone has seen it and the thing I was struck by is that these things students are discussing are not new. Additional students are sharing experience too. This shows that the college despite the efforts still has work to do. We in 2018 and 2019 have been in this place where we are helping students with similar experiences, but we weren't doing it in the way we are now. Sometimes people on campus look at people with the name Equity and Inclusion as a flu shot. Bringing us in for talks which is supper important but its only the first step. We want to prepare people to understand what does this mean at your position. Given that initial discussion what do you do moving forward, Higher education in general thinks the box is checked off after a talk. We want to move it to what can we do next. But again, I was deeply saddened and unfortunately not surprised in what people encountered. Things will stay the same. It takes effort.

Nikki: I have a point of information on some action that School in Music Theater and Dance is scheduling listening sessions. The communication part of it is being represented with an open conversation. This should be the start to creating change.

Lili: what goals are you looking forward to?

Luca: We are waiting for the climate survey to come back, and it will help us formulate a plan. The consultants looking at the surveys only do that. Therefore, they will be able to compare us to the other 700 colleges using this survey. We can see if we are behind and what we are doing right and wrong. I would not have stayed here the last 20 years if I didn't believe things weren't moving forward. It takes time. More coming soon and the consultants will be doing presentations anyone can attend.

Rishabh: If we want to get in touch, can we email you directly?

Luca: Yes! You can email me directly. You can catch me in the hallway, stop by. I am happy to chat with you. I really mean it you all are doing incredible service.
