### **Accomplishments as Coordinator of Faculty Development Activities 2001-2010**

- Led initial implementation of the Ithaca Faculty Commons, a model featuring a network of existing resources that can be centrally accessed and a robust online environment to supplement face to face activities.
- Led a one-year project, Faculty Development at Ithaca College, to evaluate current faculty development activities and propose a model that will best enable faculty without new resources. Wrote a report on the process and the model. 2008-2009
- Designed and taught an annual fall seminar for faculty members planning to apply for tenure and/or promotion to Associate Professor. 2007-2009
- Planned and supported the All-College Group Mentoring Program, initiated in 2003, which involves small mixed groups of new and experienced faculty members who set their own agendas and meet regularly for the year.
- Developed and maintain a comprehensive virtual Center for Faculty Excellence with on- and off-campus resources for teaching and scholarship.
- Designed and implemented annual Fall Faculty Welcome Workshop, half day workshop in late August
- Designed and implemented six annual all-college summer faculty institutes, on Assessment and Course Design, Implementing the Mission, Course Design for Significant Learning, Multicultural Curriculum and Service Learning. All involved active learning designs and nationally prominent presenters.

- Wrote an extensive report, "Faculty Development at Ithaca College in Perspective," for the Provost, 1/2005
- Proposed and carried out innovative method of integrating data analysis into the curriculum while disseminating results of college health surveys; presented and published about the grants.
- Helped redesign New Faculty Orientation and planned two concurrent hands-on workshops for new faculty members. Maintain contact with many new faculty members.
- Planned and produced special workshops on tenure and promotion, academic writing, late-career faculty, funding sources, and cultural communication in the classroom. Collaborated with others on a series of workshops for department chairs (Janet Reohr), student health and wellness (Priscilla Quirk) and academic advising (David Dresser and Tanya Saunders.)
- Created a discussion list, ICTeach, for communication about faculty issues. Every new faculty member is added in addition to wide distribution across campus.
- Designed, implemented, and offer regularly interactive workshops on the syllabus, course design, technology, peer visits and effective and efficient grading.
- Enhanced the Colloquium Series to include talks, workshops, performances, and discussions open to the entire campus. Revived the series in 2010.
- Organize the annual Spring Faculty Development Conference, featuring presentations by faculty who received internal funding for scholarly work. Since 2007 the half-day event included a presentation representing each of the five types of scholarship identified in the Faculty Handbook
- Provide confidential individual consultations to faculty members regarding teaching challenges.
- Support the Faculty Development Committee by writing the citations for the Excellence Awards recipients. Increased the personal detail included in the letters sent to the other nominees.
- Instituted a series of Wednesday coffees in 2003-04, a drop-in event featuring a featured person for faculty members to meet informally.
- Designed and presented a breakfast series for new faculty in 2002-2003.
- Coordinated "Making Sense of September 11," a one-credit class in the second half of fall 2001. The course involved 14 faculty and students in the planning and implementation and enrolled 175 students. It received national attention.
