

## Minor in Linguistics

The Linguistics Minor is designed to complement any academic major. The minor combines offerings from several departments. Thus it provides an interdisciplinary concentration on the science of language, ranging from descriptive and historical linguistics to socio- and psycholinguistics, language acquisition, semantics, computational linguistics, and more. It also encourages at least one semester of study in a modern or ancient language. But linguistics is decidedly not, as is frequently assumed, "just learning lots of languages." This minor, rooted firmly in the humanities and social sciences, is a rewarding addition to majors in a wide variety of academic disciplines.

The minor in Linguistics consists of a total of 18 credits of required and restricted elective courses:
