



What Should My Schedule Look Like?

- 1. ICSM 10500: Ithaca College Seminar (4 credits)
- 2. Possible Major or Minor Interests (3-6 credits)
- 3. Themes Course or Courses (Integrative Core Curriculum requirement) (3-6 credits, depending on if you are more or less uncertain of your interests)
- 4. IISP 10500: Exploring the Options (1 credit)
- **Important: It is *possible* that a course you take as a Themes/Perspectives course *could* fulfill a future major or minor requirement. Thus, DO NOT get too anxious about selecting a Themes/Perspectives course.**
- *WRTG 10600: Academic Writing is another possibility that you may be able to take first semester. If you do not get into this course, do not worry!

All college schedules look different. Do NOT PANIC if your schedule looks different from your roommate or friend.

Faculty Academic Advising and Student Academic Planning

- Advisors advise: You decide
- You must prepare for meetings
 - Make note of office hours, professor appointment calendars
- You must initiate communication after your first meeting
 - Write polite, formal emails (Dear Prof. DiFrancesco...)
- Be punctual and respectful with regards to time; cancel appointments when necessary
- Take responsibility for the grades you earn and consequences
- Follow through on referrals when professors refer you to colleagues or other campus resources
- Read syllabi and familiarize yourself with college policies
