What is the COAT Program?

Connecting Older Adults to Technology (COAT) provides 20 individuals with a free smart device and individual coaching sessions over 8 weeks. Digital coaches are provided for individuals to learn how to use the device over 6 sessions. The program goal is to increase access to technology for older adults living in rural areas.

What is a Digital Learner?

A person selected to participate in the COAT program. Preference is given to those who are:

- 60 years of age or older
- Live in a rural community
- Has access to Wi-Fi

- Makes less than \$29,160 a year
- English speaking

Do I really get a Free Lenovo Smart M10 tablet?

Yes, you really do get a FREE Lenovo Smart M10 tablet when you attend 8 sessions that include:

- a kickoff session (receive your tablet and meet your coach),
- 6 coaching sessions (completed by 6/30/23)
- attend a celebration (a thank you to our volunteer coaches and YOU!)
- completing pre/post surveys about the program

What is a Digital Coach?

A local volunteer who completed training on the Lenovo Smart M10 tablet with the Ithaca College Gerontology Institute. Digital coaches meet weekly with digital learners to help you learn how to use a SMART device based on 6 lessons.

What is a 1:1 Digital Coaching Session?

Each session is approximately 1 hour. Your digital coach and you will determine when and where to meet for your session. Attending 6 coaching sessions is required for digital learners to keep the smart device at the end of the program.

What is taught in the coaching sessions?

- Getting to know the Lenovo Smart M10 tablet
- Technology Jargon (for example: Wi-Fi, Apps, downloading, telehealth)
- Connecting to Wi-Fi, downloading Apps, creating email account
- Searching for information

- Tips for being safe online (identity theft, malware and virus, scams)
- Social Media, community organizations, library resources, online communities for older adults (Senior Planet, Get It Now).
- Video Conferencing, telehealth
- Using your tablet camera
