ICare is a referral and outreach program coordinated by the Office of Case Management (OCM) at Ithaca College. It provides support and assistance to students in distress. ICare referrals can be submitted via a webform by anyone familiar with the student. Once referred to the OCM, students will either meet with or be contacted by a caring college representative, whether it be their Residence Director, Case Manager, or other faculty/staff. The OCM focuses on offering support and assistance to each student, as they identify and navigate available resources to support their overall wellbeing and success.




In Spring 2019, the Health Center trialed **STI Express**, a new program for asymptomatic students who are interested in Sexually Transmitted Illness screening



NEW STUDENT AND TRANSITION PROGRAMS



New Student & Transition Programs was created in June of 2018 with a call to partner with and support First-Year Students, Transfer Students, First-Generation Students, Second-Year Students, Veteran Students, and Families. Our mission is clearly defined as: We actively partner with students, families, and campus colleagues to promote contagious excitement for our college. As we strive for every student to feel a sense of belonging within our community, we warmly welcome and comprehensively educate our new and returning students on critical skills, ideas, partnerships, and resources needed to successfully navigate transition into and through college.

Orientation – welcomed 1834 new students in summer orientation in 2018. Orientation will become an August only orientation model for 2019 and beyond.



OFFICE OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

Ithaca College's Office of Public Safety and Emergency Management (Public Safety) operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, from the Center for Public Safety and General Services and is staffed by Patrol and Security Services, Environmental Health and Safety, Parking Services and the Student Auxiliary Safety Patrol (SASP). 



Ithaca College is a residential institution and guarantees on-campus housing for all students for the entirety of their undergraduate career. Students are required to live on-campus for their freshmen, sophomore, and junior years. Approximately 4,395 students live on campus in 27 traditional residence halls and two apartment complexes. The Office of Residential Life has 9 full-time Residence Directors and one Community Director who live in the residence halls and apartment areas along with the students. We also employ 132 Resident/Apartment Assistants, returning students who live on the floors and help to develop community, plan events/activities, answer questions, and generally serve as a resource for the residents living on their floor.

OFFICE OF STUDENT ENGAGEMENT

The Office of Student Engagement (OSE) provides innovative and collaborative learning opportunities to empower all students at Ithaca College to feel a sense of belonging, explore their passions, and make a difference. OSE oversees and guides all of the recognition, activities, advisement, funding, and other business for student organizations; offers a comprehensive leadership education program, and coordinates volunteer programs locally and throughout the country. There are six full-time staff members and a team of 14 Student Leadership Consultants who provide all of the programs and services that OSE offers.
