

NEW MINOR IN TRANSLATION STUDIES

The Translation Studies Minor is designed to complement any academic major. It provides students interested in pursuing translation of written texts as a career or as an area of academic research with the opportunity to acquire skills and experience in the field. Students may choose to translate from French, German, Italian or Spanish into English or vice versa. Attaining a Translation Studies Minor positions students for freelance work in translation, career opportunities, and graduate school.

Core Requirements (9 credits)

1. LNGS 19402 (Introduction to the Art of Translation)

or

LNGS 25000 (Translation: The Art of Disguise)

2. LNGS 23200 (Introduction to Linguistics)

3. LNGS 49800 Senior Project in Translation

Language-Specific Requirements (9 credits)

Select one of the following language sequences for a total of 9 credits:*

FRENCH:

- FREN 35500 (French Translation in Practice)
- 6 credits at level 3 or above in French (taught in French)

GERMAN:

- GERM 35500 (German Translation in Practice)
- 6 credits at level 3 or above in German (taught in German)

ITALIAN:

- ITAL 35500 (Italian Translation in Practice)
- 6 credits at level 3 or above in Italian (taught in Italian)

SPANISH:

- SPAN 35500 (Spanish Translation in Practice)
- 6 credits at level 3 or above in Spanish (taught in Spanish)

*Note: The following conversation courses **cannot** count towards this minor requirement: FREN 34200, GERM 32300, ITAL 32300, ITAL 32400, SPAN 32300, or SPAN 32400

Total Credits Required for Program: 18

**Aside from LNGS 23200, language majors may use a maximum of 6 credits from their major program toward the Translation Studies Minor.

*** Aside from LNGS 23200, language minors may use a maximum of 3 credits from their minor program toward the Translation Studies Minor.
