- Earn your bachelors, masters, and teacher certification in five years at IC
- Expedited admission into IC graduate programs
- NYS Certification in the following areas:
  - Childhood Education (grades 1-6)
  - Agriculture Education (K-12)
  - Art Education (K-12)
  - Adolescence Education (grades 7-12)

## **EDUCATION STUDIES MAJOR (38 CREDITS)**

- 4 required courses (14 credits)
  - EDUC 10000: Education and Society
  - EDUC 21010: Educational Psychology
  - EDUC 34000: Social and Cultural Foundations of Education
  - EDUC 43000: Capstone Seminar in Education
  - 12 additional EDUC credits (3 credit @ 300 level)
  - 12 additional elective credits in EDUC, CSCR, or ESE

## **EDUCATION STUDIES MINOR (16-20 CREDITS)**

- 2 required courses (6 credits)
  - EDUC 21010
  - EDUC 34000
- 2 additional EDUC elective courses
- 2 additional elective courses in EDUC, CSCR, or ESE

## **TEACH IN FIVE PATHWAY**

- Complete Bachelors in 4 years, Masters and Teacher Certification in 5 years
- Maintain 3.0 cumulative GPA
- Work with EDUC advisor throughout
- 13 month graduate program, begins the June of the undergraduate completion year
- 2 classes (6 credits) each June and July term
- 4 classes (12 credits) and 80 hours field work Fall semester
- Student Teach Full time (6 credits) Spring semester
- 1-3 classes (3-5 credits) second June term
